

A Matter of Life and Death The Geary Bird Story

By Kenneth R. Overman

Growing up the firstborn son of fledgling cattle ranchers in the tough environs of northeast Oregon, Geary Bird knew all about hardship, hard work and perseverance. But one night when he was told his

unborn child was dead and his wife could be soon, his self-reliance and grit were not enough. It took the prayer of a local minister, and a miraculous healing, to open the door to new life for Geary Bird.

This is the true account of a man, his family, his God, and a journey that will carry the reader to the brink of death and the joy of life.



Dear Saint(s) through faith in Jesus Christ,

It is good to be reminded

of who we are and of Whose we are! We are still in this physical, material world and we are still human beings. "There is not a just person upon the earth who always does good and never sins." (Eccl. 7:20) We are sinners but, through faith in Jesus we have full forgiveness, so we are "saints"! And we are His! "See how great a love the Father has for us, that we should be called the children of God!" (I Jn. 3:1)

As we are nationally into the "back to school" mode, are you ready to renew your commitment to follow Jesus – to be a disciple/student of His? His invite is always to "Follow Me"! If folks don't follow Him, which way are they going? "There is a way that seem right to a man, but end of that way is death." (Prov. 14:12) Jesus, who came that we might have life and have it abundantly (and eternally!), would instruct us/school us from the Scriptures in how to live, how to think, how to respond to various situation, how to serve, how to endure, how to overcome, etc.

For the rest of the calendar year we are going to walk with Jesus through the Gospel according to Mark. Each Sunday for 16 out of 17 weeks between September 8 and December 29, we will dwell on one of the 16 chapters of Mark and then get a message from it that will apply to our lives. Please join me in reading that week's chapter every day of that week leading up to the Sunday where the message will be from that chapter. For example, read Mark 1 every day from Sunday, September 1 through Saturday, September 7 and hear the message on that chapter on Sunday, September 8. Next, start that Sunday, September 8 and read Mark 2 each day through Saturday, September 14 and so on!

The Apostle Paul encourages us to "let the Word of God dwell in you richly"! (Col. 3:16) Just think how well acquainted we can get with Mark's Gospel and the life of Jesus the rest of 2024. We need that guidance as much as anyone in these crazy days in our wild world of politics, inflation, war, confusion, and anxiety. God will give us clarity, peace, perseverance and power to make difference in our world and in the lives of people — only as we follow Jesus, walking with Him in the instruction of His Word.

prolife update

This past July, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) released its annual abortion report for 2023, which provides details about abortions performed in our state. Of course, these are not mere statistics. Each "number" represents real **people—real women and real children.**

Sadly, in 2023, there were 31,241 abortions performed in Michigan, which marked a 29-year high. The MDHHS report also revealed a **dramatic spike in serious abortion complications, up a shocking 38%!** These "numbers" force us to face the catastrophic impact of the past few years of reckless pro-abortion leadership in our state.

Governor Gretchen Whitmer and radical abortionobsessed legislators in Lansing ushered in a slew of dangerous legislation last year, making abortion even more dangerous for women.

Abortion clinic **health and safety regulations are GONE**. These clinics are now unregulated and unlicensed. It is no longer a requirement to give women who are considering an abortion basic medical facts about the procedure, including common risks and complications. Worse yet, non-physicians can now perform abortions in Michigan.
