"Dear Family Members in the Faith,

There are good times and there are bad times – often mixed together! Life is not easy, but Jesus desires us to have what He acame for: LIFE ABUNDANTLY! How do we get that???

I'd like to suggest that it has everything to do with what is going on in your head, not with what's going on in the world, or your immediate surroundings, or even in your body. The Word of God declares that God will keep us in **perfect peace** as our mind is "stayed/anchored/focused/locked in on" Him! (Isaiah 26:3) Perfect peace sounds like things are alright, good, manageable, and pleasant. Our circumstances might not be perfect, but we could be "okay"! That is His promise!

Here's how I understand we (and I am working at it myself!) lay hold of that peace: We go to the declarations and promises of God's Word, and we diligently seek to apply them with the assistance and accompanying work of the Holy Spirit. The Word encourages us to "set our mind/heart on things above" (Col. 3:1) – remembering heaven is our ultimate destiny. The Word encourages us to "take every thought captive to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5) that is, to align ourselves with God's will, to take His perspective on everything. The Word says "goodness and mercy will follow" us all the days of our lives and "nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus" (Ps. 23:6; Rom. 8:39) – can we believe it?!?! Then we can receive and experience it.

There are difficulties, and the challenging moments seem to be multiplying, but Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever. He will never leave us or forsake us. He is with us always. Psalm 34:4 says, "I sought the Lord and He heard me and delivered me from all my fears!" O, the precious promise of God's Word. Dwell in that Word! Meditate on the Bible truths. Soak in the riches of His comforting assurances. God's got it! Whatever the situation!



And "be thankful"! That is the way Colossians 3:15 concludes after it says, "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts . . . Part of that peace comes from remembering what God has already done, recounting His grace to you in days gone by, counting our blessings (but we can't even count that high!).

The holidays are coming, and hopefully, you get some extra time with loved ones, maybe involving travel for some. But rehearse the memories of the greatest good, the greatest blessing – that you are a "loved one" of the Heavenly Father and, through Jesus, the best is yet to come in the bliss of our heavenly home. Grateful for that AMAZING GRACE? Then, "comé, ye, thankful people come" and "[O] worship the King" – Jesus!

Philip Lloyd Mason

October 3, 1933 – October 8, 2025 (age 92)

Philip Lloyd Mason went to be with the Lord on October 8, 2025. Philip was born in 1933 in Battle Creek, MI, to Lloyd and Martha (Schumacher) Mason. He graduated from Bat-

tle Creek Central High School in 1951 and received his Bachelor of Music Education from Western Michigan College (now University).

Philip met fellow Western student Coral Lee Briney when she was assigned as accompanist for his violin lessons. They were married June 12, 1955, the day after their graduation from Western, and continued a rich collaboration that would span over 70 more years.

Faith, family, and music were integral to Philip's life. A devoted Christian who especially enjoyed reading C.S. Lewis, he was a longtime member of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Albion, MI, where he served as Sunday School superintendent, deacon, elder, and choir director. He frequently played violin for services, with Coral at the piano.

Philip was Emeritus Professor of Music at Albion College, where he taught music theory and strings for 34 years.

Philip was preceded in death by his daughter Kathy (Don) Hodges. He leaves to cherish his memory his beloved wife, Coral Lee; daughters, Jeanie (Tom) Whittle, Susie (Mark) Engstrom, and Sandy Mason (Robert) Rivera; numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
