Dear Saints through faith in Jesus and His grace and forgiveness!

Aren't we anxious for Spring?!?!? Such a cold and snowy Winter! And it seems extra long!

Jesus had a longing, a bit like we do for warmer weather and sunny days. He expressed it in Luke 12:49-50, saying, "I have come to cast fire upon the earth and how I wish it were already kindled! But I have a baptism to undergo and how distressed I am until it is accomplished!"

I suggest to you that the "fire" was to be a burning up of all sin and evil. His desire was that there would be a release from the cluttering garbage of sin and pain, hatred and animosity, guilt and shame, and all that is wrong with/in the world. After all, it says in 1 John 3:8 that Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil. Fire is a great purifier. Its intense heat helps purge away the slag and purify silver and gold. Fire takes a huge pile of debris and reduces it to a little mound of ashes. The fire can be horrible with its destruction but it can also "cleanse" a clutter forest floor of fallen trees and rotting foliage and open the possibilities of beautiful new growth and revitalization.

Jesus accomplished such fiery cleansing leading to a spiritual Springtime-like rejuvenation by undergoing a "baptism". In the verse from Luke, He is not referring to His baptism by John the Baptist at the beginning of His ministry. That was already accomplished. This was a difference immersion. He was anticipating – for that cleansing "fire" to be kindled – for Himself being flooded with the sins of all humanity and

to be plunged into the suffering and judgment that those sins had deserved. Whereas now baptism in Jesus' Name is for the forgiveness of sin, He was going to be baptized so as "to be made sin for us" (2 Cor. 5:21). The baptism of water and the Word brings a cleansing for sinners but Jesus' baptism laid on Him the sins of the whole world. He was so distressed as He faced that baptism of fire, He prayed to His Father for a way out or another way for that cleansing fire to remedy evil rather than Him going through torturous crucifixion of that cross of Calvary.



For the Christian community, Springtime always comes in like a **Lamb** and goes out like a **Lion!** As we walk through the drudgery and dreariness of Lent, we follow the Lamb as He undergoes His baptism, taking the filthy submersion of our sins through His suffering and death. Good Friday culminates with the tomb sealed with a heavy stone as His expired body is put away. But the stone is less than a speck of dust as the roaring Lion bursts through death and springs to life on that Resurrection Morning! No power can hold back the Almighty and the dynamite of His redeeming love for mankind and all creation. The seasons of the calendar year remind us of that and the calendar of the Church Year rehearse it with the revelation of Gospel Good News – death to sin and life to sinners (that is all of us!) through Jesus taking our place to kindle that fire by undergoing that baptism!

How can we but be filled with anticipation of what will spring forth! Experience the fire, the baptism and the rejuvenation of the Resurrection as we worship through March into April's early Spring!



