



Dear Saints of God in Christ Jesus,

“Steady as she goes . . .” This can be an order from the captain of a ship to the helmsman to keep the ship’s current course. Is it perhaps like a directive that **the Captain of our souls** is commanding to us in our fellow**ship**?

We all, along with nearly the whole world of mankind, have been thrown off course by this COVID-19 pandemic. The disease is quite an “unknown,” but the Scripture brings to our attention that there is “nothing new under the sun” (Eccl. 1:9). Is a virus a virus, as a virus is a virus? Have we forgotten the Spanish flu, the Asian flu, the Hong Kong flu, the Swine flu, H1N1, besides past effects of cholera, HIV/AIDS? Then there was nothing like the Bubonic plague, the Black Death, in which 75-200 million people died. Of course, that was back in the 1300s, and the world population was estimated to have been only about 430-443 million and then dropping to well under 400 million by 1400 due to that plague.

As of this writing, there have been about 2500 cases of the corona virus in Jackson County and almost 900 in Calhoun County. These are accumulative numbers for over at least a 6 month period of time, and they respectively represent 1.6% and .7% (16 in 1000 and 7 in 1000) infections. Deaths in the two counties by percentages are under 5% of those infected.

Schools are in turmoil about opening up. Some businesses are having a hard time, and then others are thriving. Unemployment numbers were way up, and now there are record levels of increased employment in the last couple of months. Some churches are not open. Others never closed. Some are doing things differently, from parking lot gatherings to songless worship. Some congregations haven’t modified any element of their Sunday morning gatherings. Some haven’t held “in-person” services since the mid-March shut down.

With that stated, St. Paul has made adjustments to our worship format on Sundays. We have been meeting in the sanctuary since June. No one has reported becoming sick or infected by participating. A couple of recommendations have been made for members, ranging from “more cautions” to “more singing.” We have had more than 50 in attendance since re-opening, and considering it is summer and there are travels and vacations, we have held steady with closer to 60 per week.

Where do we go from here? Who makes the call? Doing basketball officiating reminds me that no one is ever going to be happy with all my “calls.” While some calls may please some in the stands and players on the court, it is guaranteed to irritate others in the stands and on the court.

So here is the “call”: **Stay the course! Steady as she goes!** We have been in some rough waters, and we can’t really tell how deep we are in. We could tip one way or the other. Things could settle down quickly or stir up again wildly (Isn’t it really **always** like that?). No one is compelled to attend worship on Sunday, and even our shut-ins now have access to view and/or hear our Sunday service. We have made some significant strides in the technology and are making more, so the Word is heard at home through devices (Facebook, CD’s and DVDs) as well as from the sanctuary. We will continue as we have with our **Sunday morning worship** procedures, moving to the 10am time September 13, with **Bible class** in Luther Hall (more space) at 9am on the topic of “Prophetic Projections from Zechariah” (please read up on that OT prophet – second last book in our Old Testament). We will get back on course with a **women’s Bible Study** on Tuesdays starting September 15 at 9:30am in the Conference Room. We will adjust our course on Thursday and move the **prayer time** from 8:15am to commence at 9:15am, followed by our “steady as we go” 10am Thursday viewing of the **“Foundations of Freedom” DVD with discussion**. 12:15pm prayer that day is in the parsonage with Pastor’s mom – you are welcome to join!



Thankfully Jesus is with us as we “row, row, row the boat”! We await the wind of His Spirit to fill our sails and move us forward to the destination of His design. In the meantime, we still inwardly have rest “beside the still waters” where our souls are restored by the nurturing power of God’s Word. Make sure you are in the flow of that life-giving fountain – as our delight is in the Law of the Lord, we flourish like trees planted by the water, not withering but bearing fruit!







It's not usually a good idea to try and list things because you're bound to miss something, but I just couldn't resist trying. In this case, it's just not enough to say, "thanks for everything."


